

FIJI'S GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT 2005-2008

Fiji's gross domestic product (GDP) is a basic measure of its economic performance. It is equal to the sum of the value added at every stage of production by all the industries within Fiji, plus taxes less subsidies on products, in the period being reported. It includes estimates on the non-monetary production as well as the informal sector. An estimate on the illegal activities has not been made due to data constraints. The United Nations System of National Accounts 2008 (SNA 2008) guidelines have been used for the compilation. Source of the data has been administrative records, surveys and special studies conducted by the Fiji Islands Bureau of Statistics (FIBOS).

GDP CURRENT PRICE

Fiji's GDP at current factor cost is estimated to grow at 4.2 per cent in 2008. This is an absolute increase of 1.6 per cent from 2007 when the growth was 2.6 per cent. The 2.6 per cent growth in 2007 was an absolute decline of 2.4 per cent over 2006 when the growth was 5.0 per cent. Table 1 gives data on the GDP at current price, at factor cost and at market price by activity from 2005 to 2008. The activities are classified according to the Fiji Standard Industrial Classification 2004 (FSIC) which is based on the International Standard Industrial Classification Revision 3.1. For more detail, refer to Appendix 1.

From 2006 to 2008 the GDP at current price:

- Factor cost shows that the economy has grown at an average rate of 3.9 per cent.
- Market price shows that the economy has grown at an average rate of 3.8 per cent.

GDP CONSTANT PRICE

Fiji's GDP constant price estimate now has as its base 2005 = 100.0. Expressing GDP in constant prices involved revaluing the current price time series of goods and services in the prices of 2005 by means of quantity revaluation, price deflation and extrapolation. Expressing GDP in the prices of 2005 = 100.0, shows production growth regardless of the changes in the purchasing power of the Fiji dollar.

The New Weights

Industries have been assigned weights based on the relative importance of that industry to the total GDP eg the Value Added (VA) of Agriculture accounted for 10.56 per cent of the total VA in 2005, so therefore it has a weight of 10.56. The combined weight of all industries equals 100.0. Table 2 shows the absolute change in weight from 1995 to 2005. Changes in the weight have been brought about by:

- More exhaustive coverage of the specific industries so therefore the weights get distributed at the FSIC sub-class level.
- Implementation of the SNA 2008.
- Improved compilation methodology.
- Availability of more suitable indicators.
- Some industries did not perform as well as they did in 1995.

Agriculture, which has always had the highest weight, now ranks fourth. For 2005 it is the transport, storage and communication sector that has the highest weight. Contributing most to the weight of the transport, storage and communication sector is telecommunication which in 2005 has a weight of 5.89 compared to 1995 when its weight was 3.59. Not far behind the transport, storage and communication sector is the manufacturing sector with a weight of 14.23 followed by the wholesale and retail; repair of motor vehicles, motor cycles and personal and household goods sector with a weight of 12.67. Agriculture ranks fourth with a weight of 10.56.

Note: Refer to Appendix 2 for the comparison of the 2005 weights with the 2002 weights. Unfortunately, despite re-basing the GDP to 2002, constant price estimates could not be estimated using those weights due to staff shortage. Nonetheless, the GDP 2002 = 100.0 was used for the purposes of compiling the Tourism Satellite Account 2002.

GDP constant price estimates are now based on the 2005 weights. Refer Table 3 below. For more detail, refer to Appendix 3.

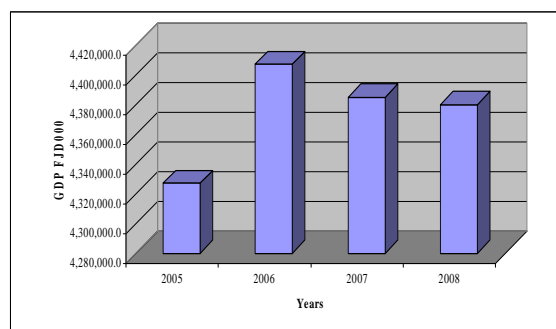

Level of GDP

Fiji's constant price GDP is provisionally estimated at \$4380.3 million for the calendar year 2008. Of this \$349.0 million or 8.0 per cent was contributed by non-monetary production; that is, from the own account activities in the agriculture, fishing and forestry and construction sectors and the notional owner occupied dwellings in the real estate sector. When compared to 2007, GDP in 2008 shows a decline of \$5.2 million. Per capita GDP at constant

price for 2008 was \$5235.17

On the new base,

- GDP for 2007 stands at \$4385.5 million of which \$347.3 million or 7.9 per cent was contributed by the non-monetary production. When compared to 2006, GDP in 2007 shows a decline of \$22.0 million. Per capita GDP at constant price for 2007 was \$5269.69.
- GDP for 2006 stands at \$4407.5 million of which \$345.7 million or 7.8 per cent was contributed by the non-monetary production. When compared to 2005 when the constant price GDP was \$4327.3 million, GDP in 2006 shows an increase of \$80.2 million. Per capita GDP at constant price for 2006 was \$5312.23 compared to 2005 when it was \$5234.8.

The change in the estimates previously released for 2007 and 2006 is due to:

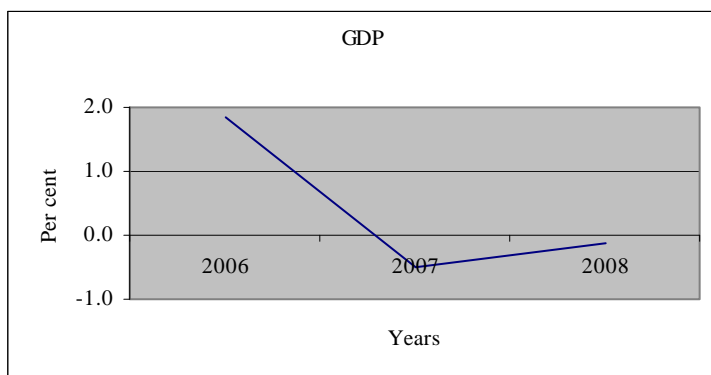
- A more recent base which takes into account the changing structure of the industry.
- Actual annual business survey data becoming available for all industries that FIBOS surveys annually.
- Availability of more up-to-date indicators for the estimation of those industries that are surveyed on an ad hoc basis. Notable amongst them are:
 - The Consumer price index with 2005 = 100.0 as its base.
 - The Building material price index with 2005 = 100.0 as its base.
 - The Industrial production index with 2005 = 100.0 as its base.
 - Data from the Household Income and Expenditure Survey and the Employment and Unemployment Survey from FIBOS' Household Survey Division.
 - Data on the Value Added Tax.

Composition of GDP

Transport, storage and communication sector contributes most to the GDP. In 2008 it accounted for 14.31 per cent of the GDP, in 2007 15.04 per cent and in 2006 15.13 per cent. Manufacturing is the second highest contributor. In 2008 it accounted for 13.53 per cent of the GDP, in 2007 14.12 per cent and in 2006 14.95 per cent. Third highest contributor is the Wholesale and retail; repair of motor vehicles and motor cycles and personal and household goods. In 2008 it accounted for 12.14 per cent of the GDP, in 2007 12.36 per cent and in 2006 11.72 per cent. Agriculture ranked fourth in terms of contribution to the GDP. In 2008 it accounted for 10.49 per cent of GDP, in 2007 10.37 and in 2006 10.69 per cent. Refer to Appendix 4 for more details.

Growth in GDP

Graph 2: GDP constant price growth 2006 – 2008



The economy, though still in the negative, shows improvement in 2008, from -0.5 per cent growth in 2007 to -0.1 per cent growth. Sectors contributing to the improvement are:

- Agriculture with a weight of 10.56 growing by 1.0 per cent.
- Forestry with a weight of 1.08 growing by 5.8 per cent.
- Fishing with a weight of 2.43 growing by 4.9 per cent.
- Construction with a weight of 3.18 growing by 7.3 per cent.
- Hotels and restaurants with a weight of 4.26 growing by 1.4 per cent.
- Financial intermediation with a weight of 7.89 growing by 6.7 per cent.
- Education with a weight of 5.15 growing by 2.1 per cent.
- Other community, social and personal services with a weight of 4.87 growing by 8.0 per cent.

In 2007 the economy declined by 0.5 per cent. Except for the following five sectors, all others experienced negative growths:

- Electricity and water with a weight of 1.37 growing by 79.2 per cent.
- Wholesale and retail; repair of motor vehicles, motor cycles and personal and household goods with a weight of 12.67 growing by 4.9 per cent
- Hotels and restaurants with a weight of 4.26 growing by 15.1 per cent.
- Financial intermediation with a weight of 7.89 growing by 40.4 per cent.
- Health and Social work with a weight of 2.12 growing by 6.5 per cent.

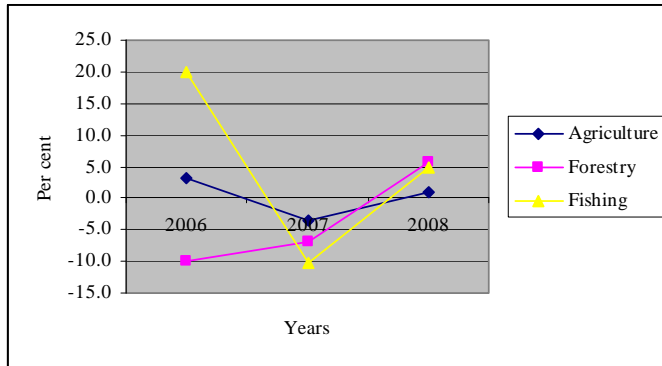
In 2006 the economy grew by 1.9 per cent. Contributing to the increase is:

- Agriculture with a weight of 10.56 grew by 3.1 per cent.
- Fishing with a weight of 2.43 grew by 19.9 per cent.
- Manufacturing with a weight of 14.23 grew by 7.0 per cent.
- Transport, storage and communication with a weight of 14.98 grew by 2.8 per cent.
- Real estate and business services with a weight of 9.28 grew by 4.0 per cent.
- Public administration with a weight of 5.56 grew by 35.4 per cent.
- Education with a weight of 5.15 grew by 4.4 per cent.

The decline in the sugarcane and taro VA underpinned the decline of the agricultural sector in 2007.

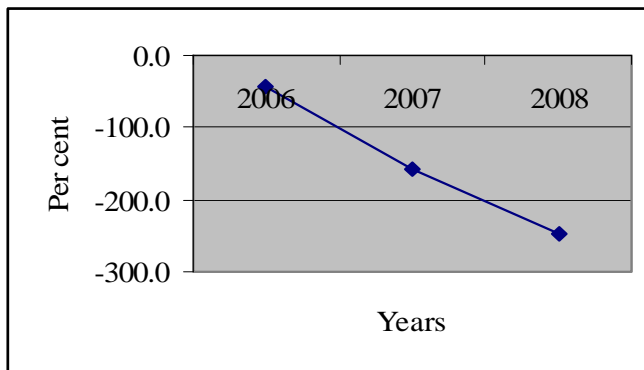
Fishing

Forestry

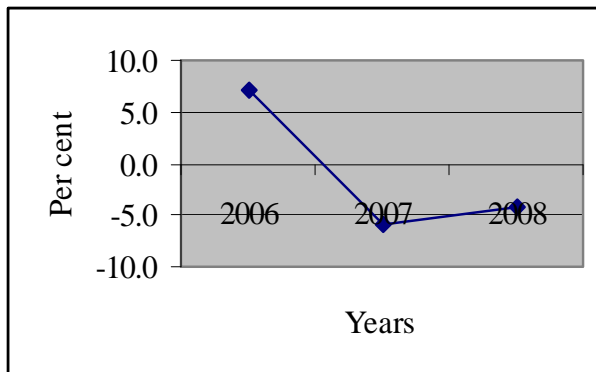
The improvement from 2006 to 2007 and in 2008 when the sector finally has a positive growth is due to the improvement in the VA of both native and exotic wood.

Graph 4: VA in Mining and Quarrying



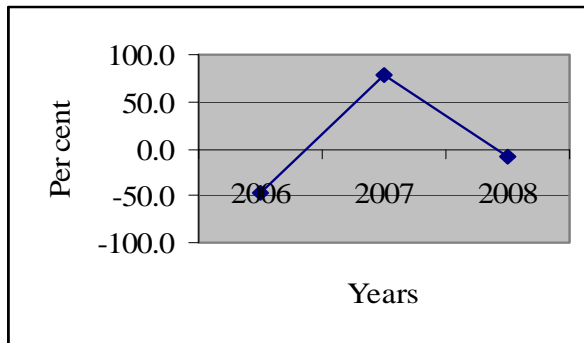
The decline in the mining and the quarrying sector from 2006 to 2008 is due to the decline in the VA of mining.

Graph 5: VA in Manufacturing



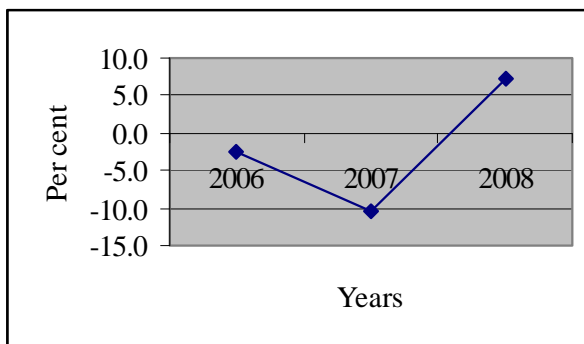
In 2007, with the exception of a few, all industries in the manufacturing sector experienced negative growths. 2008 shows improvement because of a few industries performing better.

Graph 6: VA in Electricity and water



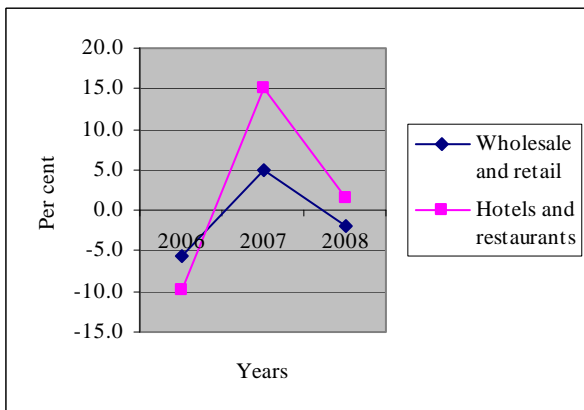
The decline in the VA of electricity as a result of the high fuel costs, led the sector to decline in 2006. The decline in 2008 is due to the decline in the production of electricity.

Graph 8: VA in Distributive Trade



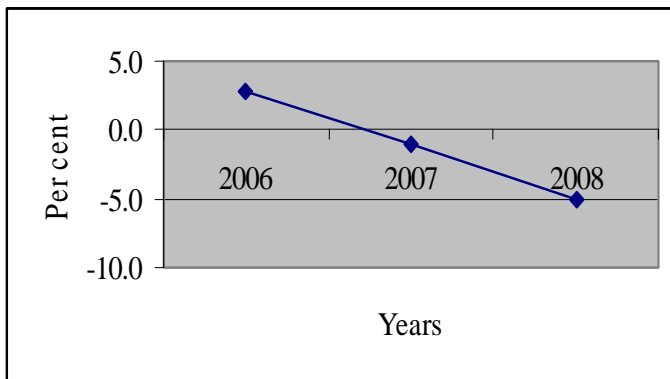
Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles, motor cycles and personal and household goods

Hotels and restaurants

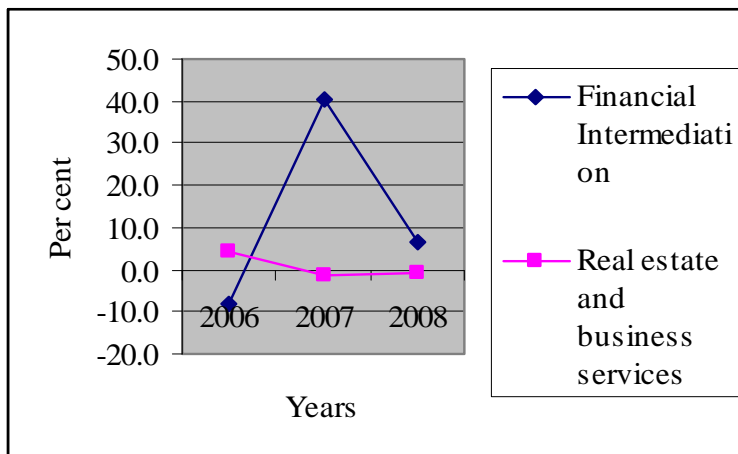
The significant growth in the hotel and restaurant activities in 2007 is due to the travel packages offered.

Graph 10: VA in Real Estate and Business Services and Financial Intermediations



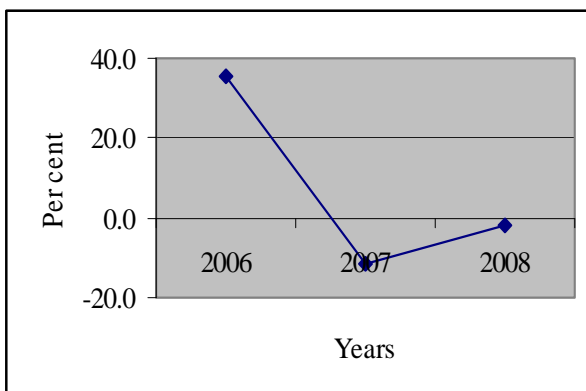
Financial Intermediation

Real estate and business services

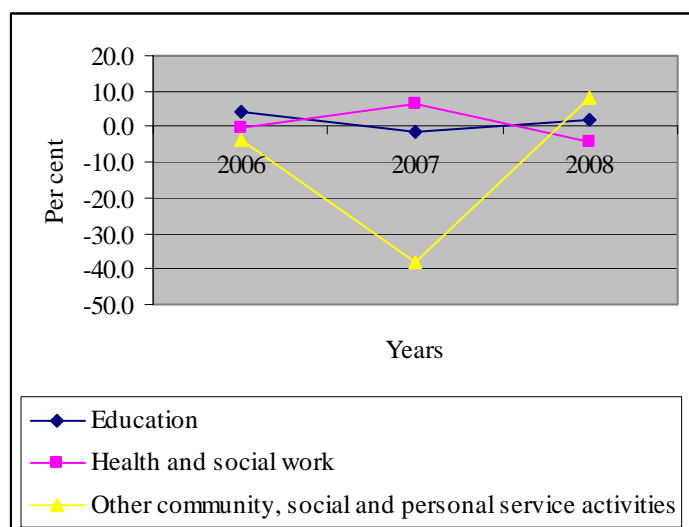
The decline in the real estate and business services sector is due to the decline in the VA of the business services sector.

The decline in the Value Added of Public Administration and Defence in 2007 is due to the decline in the VA in General Public service activities.

Education

The decline in 2007 in the education sector is due to the decline in the VA for higher education.

Health and social work

The decline in the health and the social work sector in 2008 is due to the decline in the VA of health services of the General Government.

Other community, social and personal service activities

In 2007 significant declines were noted in the VA of the General Government, the informal sector and the non-general Government.

Market / Non-Market Split

Of the total GDP, percentage of goods and services sold at economically significant prices were:

- 2005 - 78.1 per cent;
- 2006 - 76.6 per cent,
- 2007 – 78.3 per cent and
- 2008 – 78.4 per cent.

The criteria used for classifying activities into market and non-market is the price at which the goods and services are provided eg if a seller sells goods and services at a significant price that would be considered a market activity but if the goods and services are provided free or at an insignificant price that would be considered non-market. There are some borderline cases though, plus for some of the activities data are consolidated and cannot be split. Refer to Appendix 5 for more details.

Formal / Informal Split

Of the total GDP, percentage of goods and services produced in the formal sector were:

- 2005 - 83.1 per cent;
- 2006 - 83.7 per cent,
- 2007 – 83.2 per cent and
- 2008 - 82.9 per cent.


