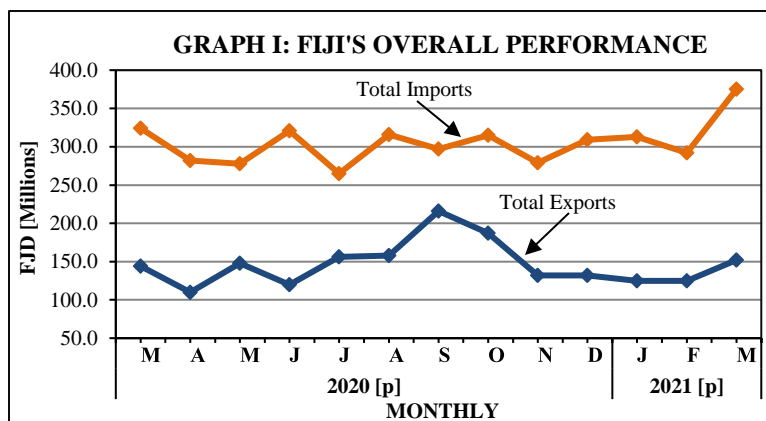
## INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE STATISTICS

### March 2021

**Provisional** data put the total value of goods imported in March 2021 at \$375.0 million while the value of total exports was \$151.7 million. (Refer Graph I).

Compared to March 2020, total imports and total exports increased by \$50.9 million (15.7%) and \$7.8 million (5.4%) respectively.

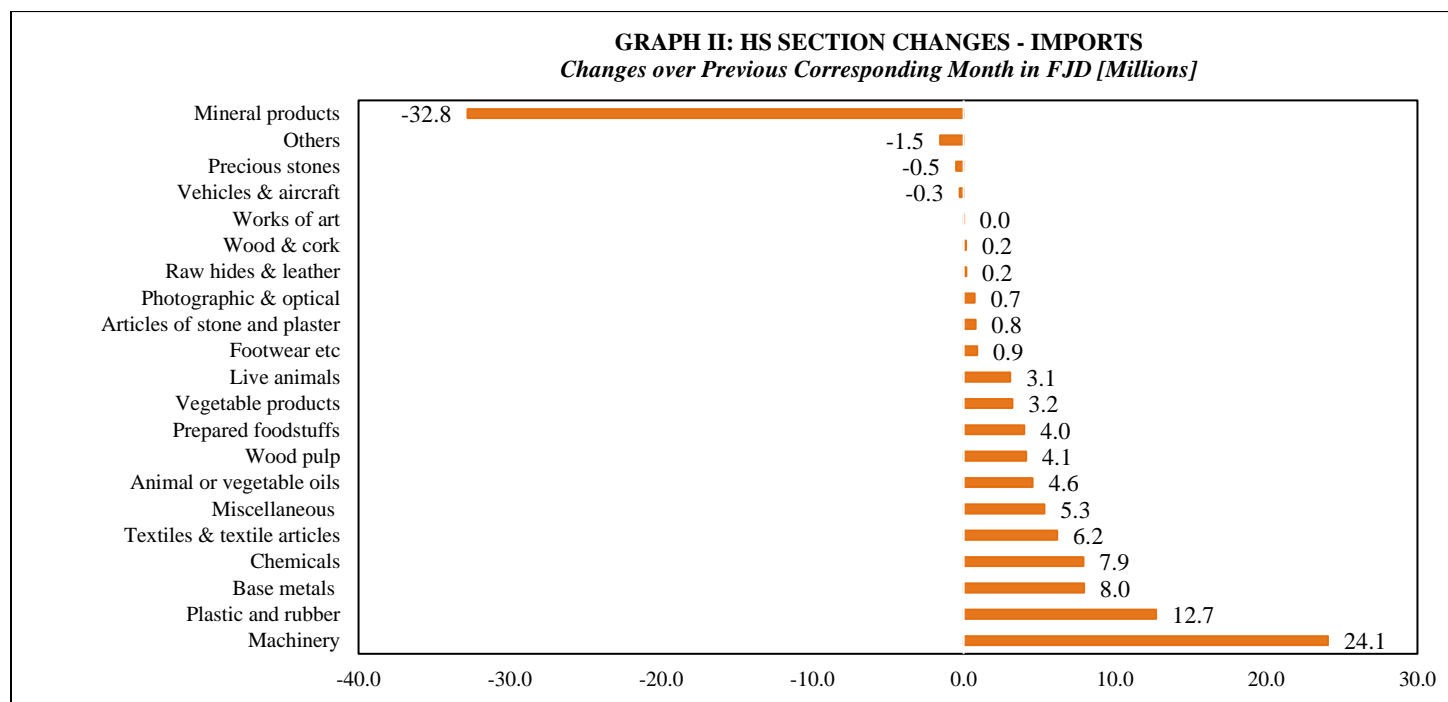
The March 2021 trade deficit amounted to \$223.3 million compared to \$166.6 million a month earlier (February).

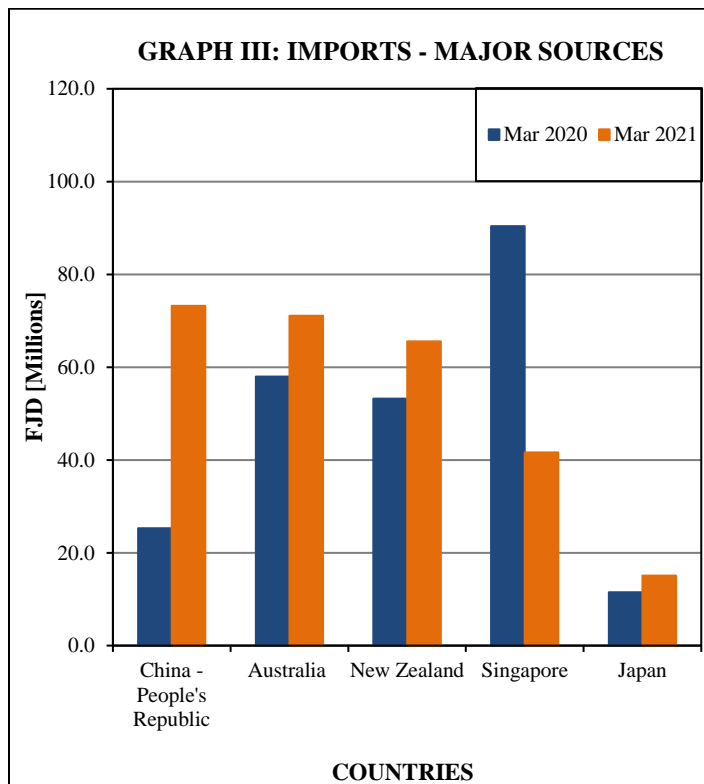
### IMPORTS

Detailed HS section changes over March 2020 are as follows:



Compared to March 2020, the import categories recording notable increases and decrease were:

Plastic, rubber & articles thereof	↑ 12.7	96.4%	Increased imports of other polymers of styrene, in primary forms, other polyesters, other new pneumatic tyres of rubber of a kind used on buses or lorries and tubes, pipes & hoses & fittings thereof of plastics.
Base metals & articles thereof	↑ 8.0	36.4%	Increased imports of roofing framework, plates, rods, angles, shapes & sections, bridges & bridge-sections, other semi-finished products of iron or non-alloy steel and other flat-rolled products of iron or non-alloy steel.
Chemicals and allied products	↑ 7.9	32.6%	Increased imports of other medicaments and vaccines for human medicine.
Textiles and textile articles	↑ 6.2	60.6%	Increased imports of other woven fabrics of polyester staple fibres, mixed mainly or solely with viscose rayon, staple fibres, man-made filament or wool or fine animal hair, other knitted or crocheted fabric and other dyed woven fabrics of cotton.

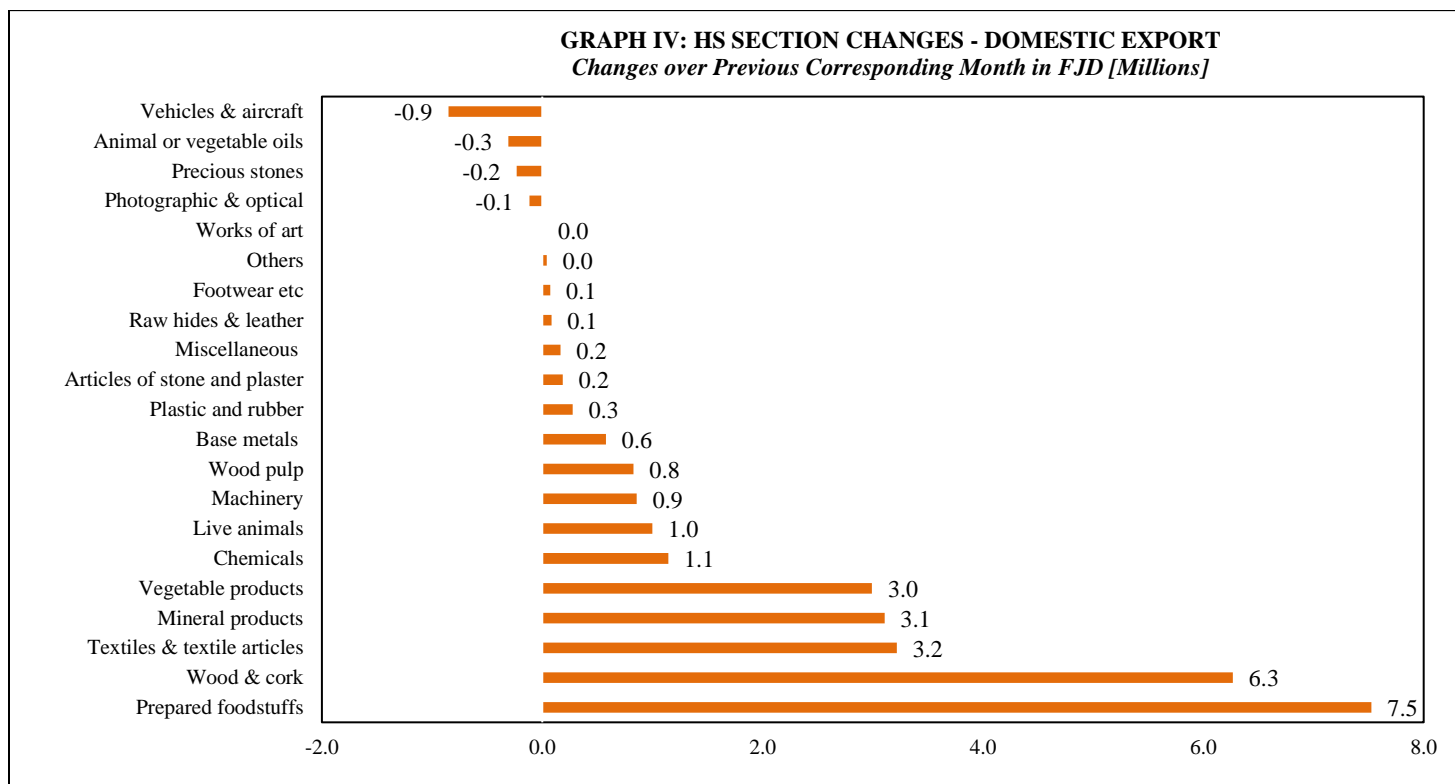
For the month of March 2021, Fiji's major sources of imports (Refer Graph III) were:

- **China - People's Republic**, up \$47.9 million (189.1%) to \$73.2 million due to increased imports of petroleum bitumen, roofing framework, plates, rods, angles, shapes, sections and semi-milled or wholly milled rice, prepared or preserved mackerel and bridges & bridge sections;
- **Australia**, up \$13.2 million (22.7%) to \$71.1 million due to increased imports of other welded or circular cross-section of iron or non-alloy steel, other medicaments, other preparations of kind in animal feeding, other kraftliner and butanes;
- **New Zealand**, up \$12.3 million (23.1%) to \$65.6 million due to increased imports of telephones for cellular networks or other wireless networks, other fresh or chilled potatoes, portable automatic data processing machines and other semi-finished products of non-alloys steel;
- **Singapore**, down \$48.7 million (53.9%) to \$41.7 million due to decreased imports of gas-oil (diesel), aviation turbine fuel, light oils & preparations (motor spirit), cement clinkers and residual fuel oil; and

- **Japan**, up \$3.6 million (31.0%) to \$15.1 million due to increased imports of used or reconditioned passenger motor cars and racing cars.

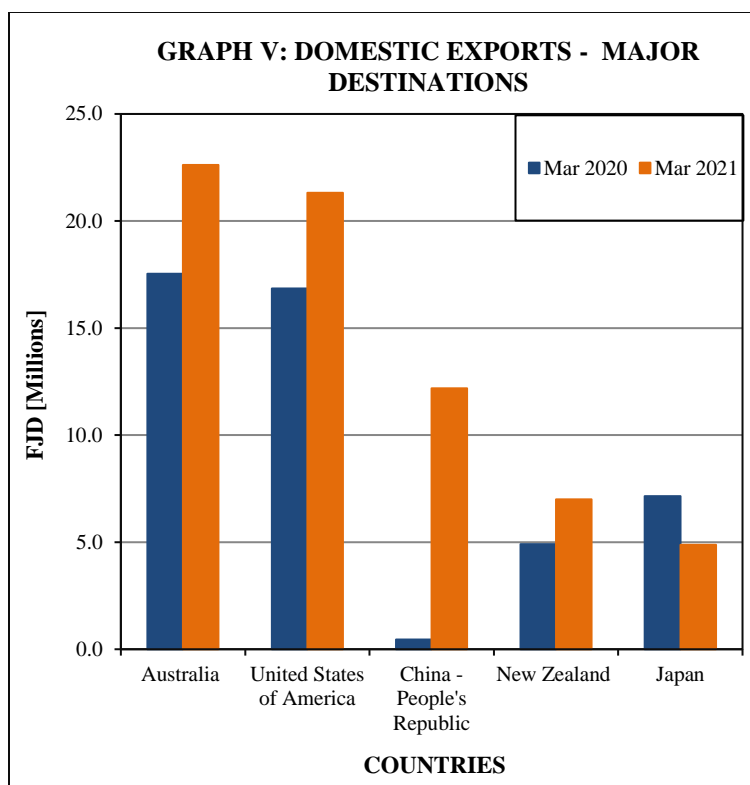
## DOMESTIC EXPORTS

Detailed HS section changes over March 2020 are as follows:



Compared to March 2020, the domestic export categories recording notable increases were:

HS Section	Change in Value FJD [Millions]	% Change	Comments
Prepared foodstuffs, beverages, spirits & tobacco	↑ 7.5	30.1%	Increased domestic exports of mineral water, instant noodles and sweet biscuits.
Wood, cork & articles thereof & plaiting material	↑ 6.3	79.5%	Increased domestic exports of wood in chips or particles.

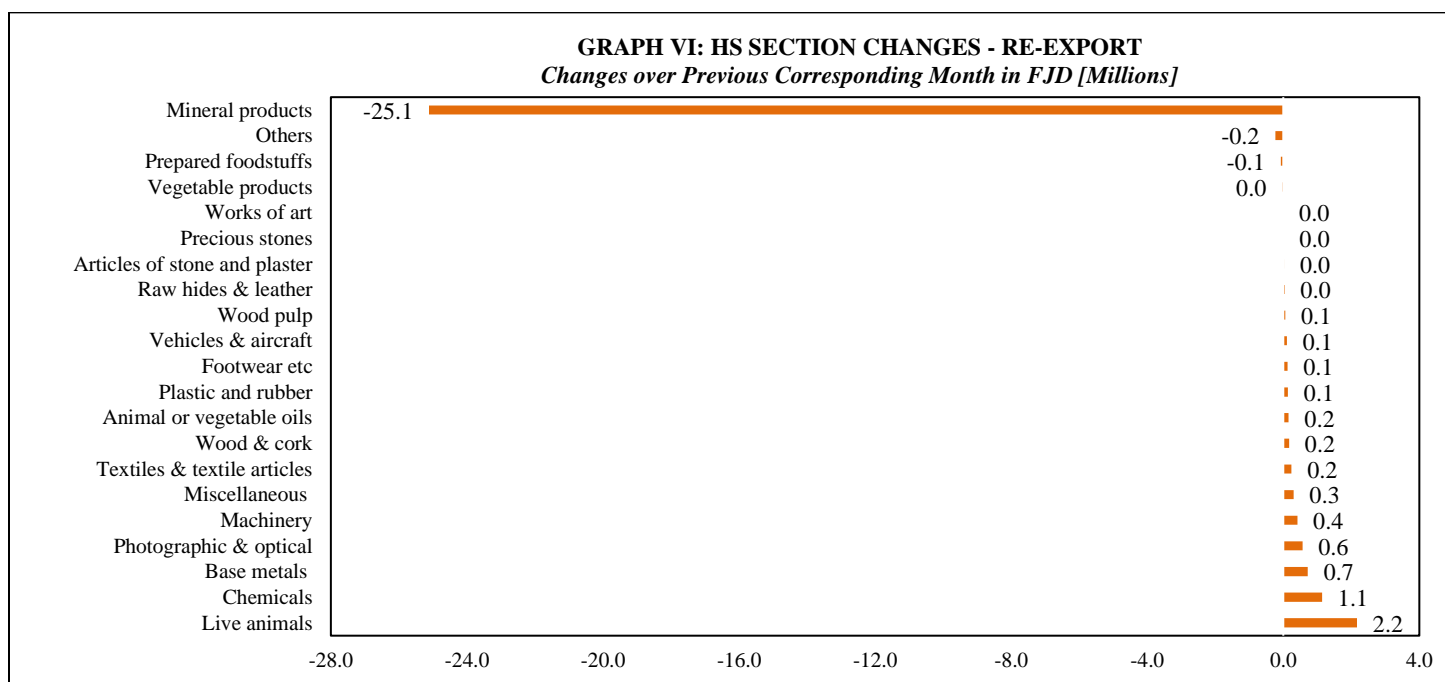


For the month of March 2021, Fiji's major domestic export destinations (Refer Graph V) were:

- **Australia**, up \$5.1 million (29.0%) to \$22.6 million due to increased exports of sweet biscuits, other women's or girl's garments made up of fabric, trousers, bib & brace overalls, breeches & shorts of other textile materials and other medicaments;
- **United States of America**, up \$4.5 million (26.6%) to \$21.3 million due to increased exports of mineral water, kava or yaqona and turmeric (curcuma);
- **China - People's Republic**, up \$11.7 million (2,619.4%) to \$12.2 million due to increased exports of wood in chips or particles, agglomerated iron ores & concentrates, other than roasted iron pyrites and mineral water;
- **New Zealand**, up \$2.1 million (42.5%) to \$7.0 million due to increased exports of other medicaments, taro, life-jackets & life-belts and other tubes, pipes & hoses, rigid of polymers; and
- **Japan**, down \$2.3 million (31.8%) to \$4.9 million due to decreased exports of wood in chips or particles.

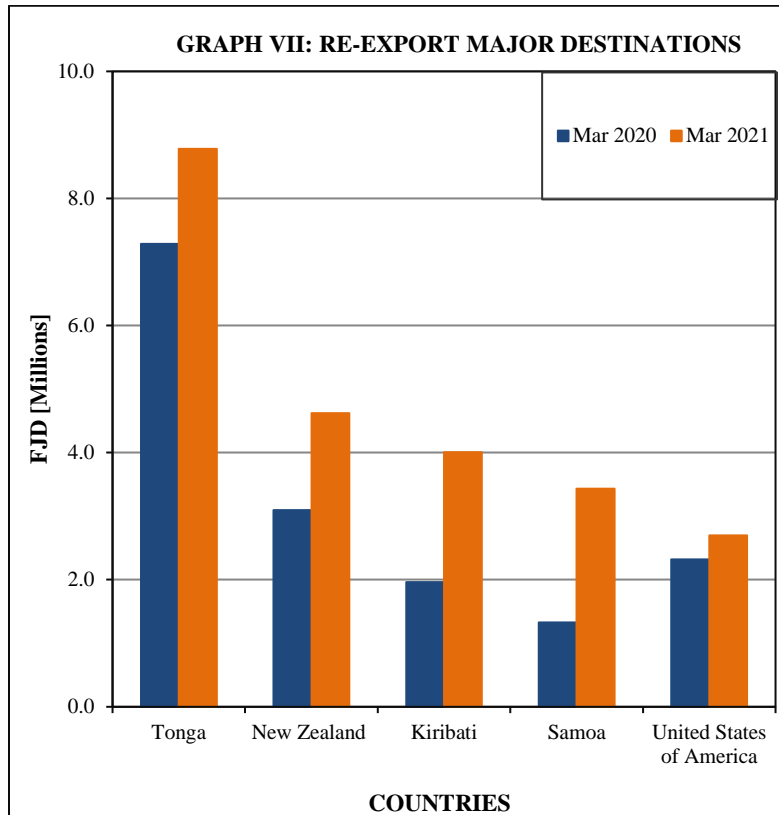
## RE-EXPORTS

Detailed HS section changes over March 2020 are as follows:



Compared to March 2020, the re-export category recording a notable decrease was:

HS Section	Change in Value FJD [Millions]	% Change	Comment
Mineral products	↓ 25.1	- 53.6%	Decreased re-exports of aviation turbine fuel and gas-oil (diesel).



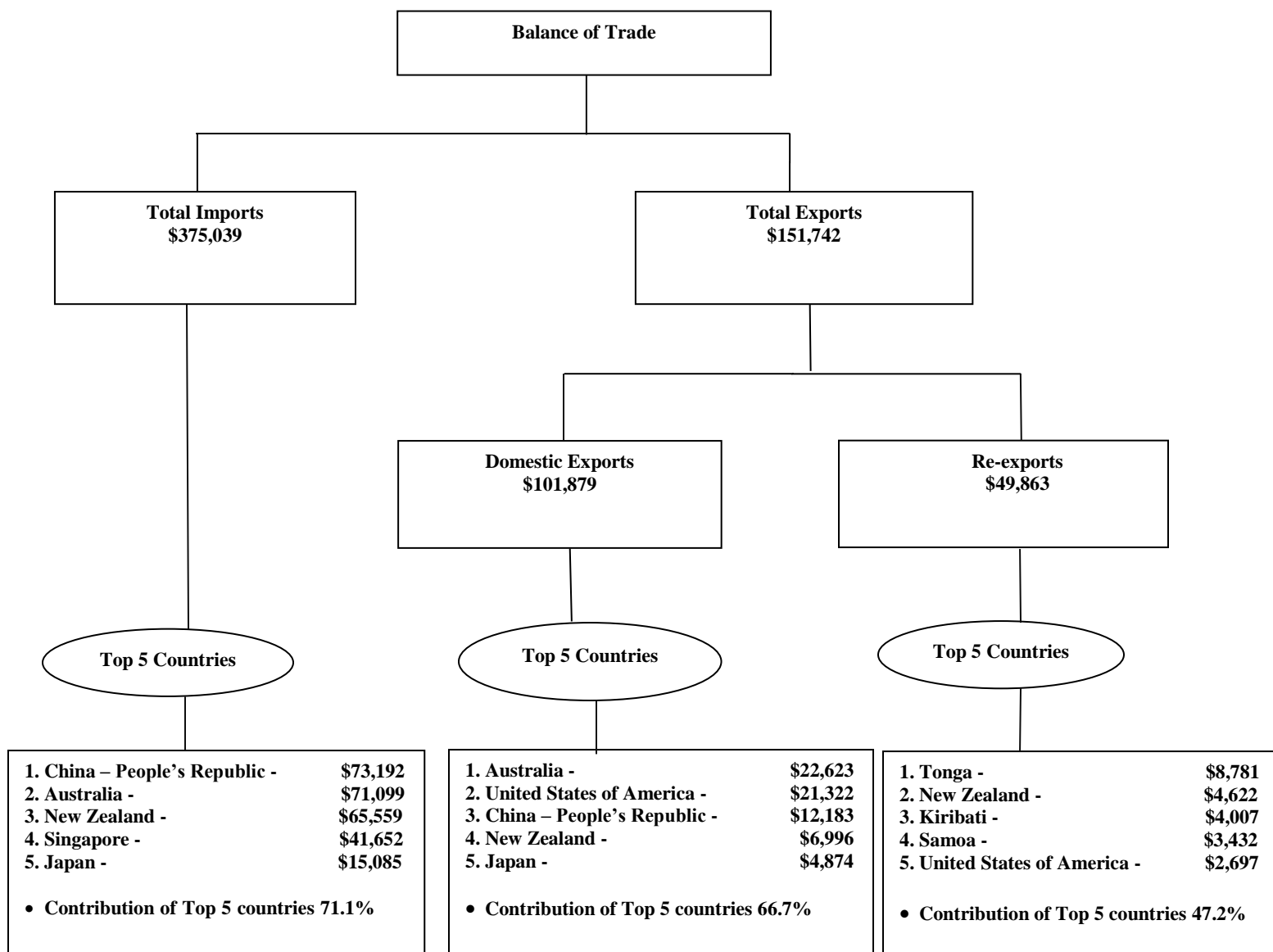
For the month of March 2021, Fiji's major re-export destinations (Refer Graph VII) were:

- **Tonga**, up \$1.5 million (20.6%) to \$8.8 million due to increased re-exports of gas-oil (diesel) and light oils & preparations (motor spirit);
- **New Zealand**, up \$1.5 million (49.4%) to \$4.6 million due to increased re-exports of gas-oil (diesel), containers for compressed or liquefied gas, of iron or steel, tuna and waste & scrap of tinned iron or steel;
- **Kiribati**, up \$2.0 million (104.3%) to \$4.0 million due to increased re-exports of coolroom freezer panels, other parts suitable for use solely or principally with boilers and other telephone sets, including telephones for cellular network or for other wireless networks;
- **Samoa**, up \$2.1 million (158.6%) to \$3.4 million due to increased re-exports of light oils & preparations (motor spirit), vaccines for human medicine and petroleum bitumen; and
- **United States of America**, up \$0.4 million (16.1%) to \$2.7 million due to increased re-exports of safety razor blades including razor blade blanks in strips and tuna.

**FJD [000]**





3. Concepts and Definitions

All concepts and definitions are based on *United Nations International Merchandise Trade Statistics: Concepts and Definitions*.

- Coverage – Goods that add to or subtract from the stock of material resources of a country by entering (imports) or leaving (exports) its economic territory are recorded.
  - Time of Recording – Goods are to be included at the time when they enter or leave the economic territory of a country; in the case of customs-based data collection systems, the time of recording should be the date of lodgment of the customs declaration.
  - Trade System – General Trade System of data recording is used since the statistical territory coincides with the economic territory.
  - Commodity Classification – The Harmonized System (HS) is used. From 2009, SITC Revision 4 is being used.
  - Valuations – Cost, insurance and freight (CIF) valuation is used for all imports and free on board (FOB) is used for all exports.
4. The commentary in this release only gives reasons for increases and decreases of those HS categories that have **increased or decreased by five million dollars or more**.
